REQUEST FOR HEARING

to

Nicola Sturgeon (First Minister of Scotland) MSP

We the People would like to inform you of the expanding position of the Common Law Court. On 11th June 2017 in Dunblane, Scotland, 'We the People' convened our first Common Law Court. Since then, we have continued to develop and progress our system under common law, and it is for this reason that 'We the People' require a meeting with your government officials.

As living men and women we are aware of the need to work with statutory authorities so as to protect our inalienable rights.

In a recently convened court 'We the People' issued a Common Law Court Order (CO/DUN/21/1) confirming the requirement to create a new CLC Diplomatic Service.

It is hereby ordered that after a unanimous decision of the court, the Plaintiff is tasked with the issue of creating and establishing the set up Common Law Court Diplomatic Service, these diplomats are to be appointed and will represent living men and women throughout the world.

In relation to the appointment of CLC Diplomats, these individuals will be appointed for each country, if and when required and will act as a point of contact with statutory authorities. The Common Law Court currently has eight diplomats in seven different countries, and we would like to offer you and your ministers the opportunity to meet with our Diplomat for Scotland, on behalf of the people, to discuss some matters that require immediate attention.

CLC Diplomats represent the living men and women who stand under the authority and jurisdiction of the Common Law Court Declaration 2019. CLC Diplomats will also be afforded the diplomatic immunity, privileges and rights issued to them by the people.

The requirement for this meeting is to assist with any concerns that you may have, regarding the people and for clarification. Additionally, this meeting will also be used to shed light on the concerns that the people have in relation to the statutory authorities.

To assist you in this process, please note the following:

1. 'We the People' that stand under the authority and jurisdiction of the Common Law Court wish to send two of our current diplomats to attend this meeting.
2. While we are happy to accommodate any of your ministers at this meeting, we would require at the very least, a representative from each of the following departments:
 - a) Active Travel

 - c) Education
 - d) Healthcare
 - e) Justice and Law Officers
 - f) Local Government
 - g) Policing
 - h) Social Justice
 - i) Transport
3. To assist you in this matter, we understand that such a meeting would be beneficial to have at the Scottish Parliament, therefore we are happy to use this venue as a meeting place. If you prefer another venue, or require us to provide one we are happy to assist if required?
 4. Given the requirement for this meeting, 'We the People' would like a reply from you within fourteen days from the receipt of this letter. We would expect a confirmed date for our meeting within the next seven days after that.
